This supplemental/bid Bulletin is issued to provide information to prospective bidders on the following amendments and clarifications in the bidding document:

Section 1. Invitation to Bid on, first paragraph on page 5	The completion of the project is required within ninety (90) days from the issuance of the Notice to Proceed.	The completion of the project is required within ninety (90) calendar days from the date that Verizon issues the access/construction permit to the winning bidder.
Section VII. Technical Specifications, Part E.5.b, page 6	Deployment, configuration, and testing of the project must be completed within ninety (90) calendar days after acceptance of Notice to Proceed.	Deployment, configuration, and testing of the project must be completed within ninety (90) calendar days from the date that Verizon issues the access/construction permit to the winning bidder.
Section VII. Technical Specifications, D. Minimum Technical Requirements no. 5	Unlimited usage of up to 10 participants in a video conference session	Unlimited usage of a minimum of 10 participants in a video conference session.
Section VIII. Checklist for the Opening of Bids, p. 72	Statement of all its ongoing and completed government and private contract within the past three (3) years from the submission of bids, including contracts awarded but not yet	Statement of all its ongoing and completed government and private contract, similar to this Project, within the past three (3) years from the submission of bids, including contracts awarded but not yet started, if any.

	started, if any.	The Bidder must also submit a copy of the single largest similar contract together with certificate of final acceptance/completion from the Bidder's client or official receipt of the Bidder for the said contract.
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It is further informed that in lieu of a bid security mentioned in Section I.ITB clause no. 18.1, page 23, the bidder may submit a **Bid Securing Declaration**. It is an undertaking which states, among others, that the bidder shall enter into contract with the procuring entity and furnish the performance security required under ITB Clause 33.2, page 35, from the receipt of the Notice of Award, and committing to pay the corresponding fine, and be suspended for two (2) years from being qualified to participate in any government procurement activity in the event it violates any of the conditions state therein as provided in the guidelines issued by the GPPB. This Declaration must be sworn to before a Notary Public. The form and substance of this Declaration is also found on page 71 of the Bidding Documents.
